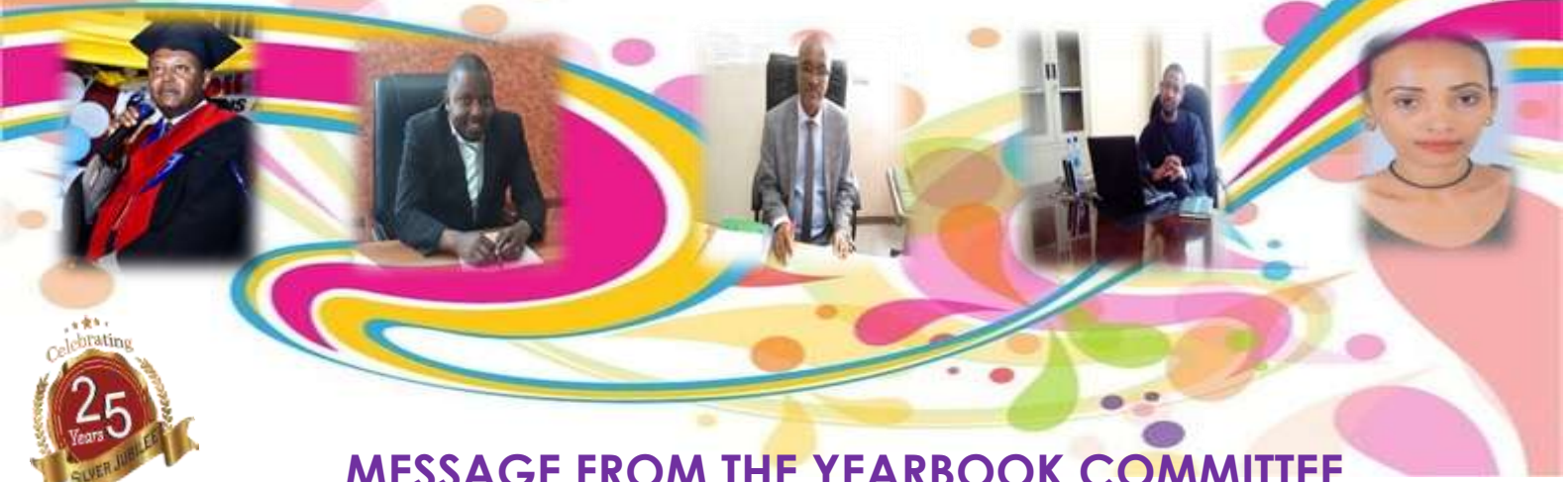

Dear students, staff, parents, and alumni,

Dandii Boru school kindergarten is giving for toddlers quality early childhood education by updating the curriculum with the current standard system which involves students learning through play methodology.

When children experience quality early education and care, their short-term cognitive, social and emotional development take a boost. Similarly, early education and care facilitates their long-term success in academics and even later lives.

In addition, parents have a crucial part to play to ensure early childhood development in their children. Involved parents can make a positive and lasting impact on their children's learning ability. Children who are properly stimulated from birth to age seven by their parents tend to perform better than other children in the long run. What this means is that these children are more likely to complete their schooling, perform better academically, and lead healthier and more productive lives as adults.

Children's development of the cognitive and social skills needed for success later in school is supported by responsive parenting. Responsiveness plays an important role in providing a strong foundation for children to develop optimally. This includes positive affection and high levels of warmth in combination with behaviors that are cognitively responsive to the child's needs.

Besides, the role of the school on the early childhood education, parent involvement can extend the experiences that a child has inside the classroom to actual activities that happen in the home. Parents who are in tune with the primary school curriculum and keep themselves updated with what is happening in their children's classroom are better able to establish a connection between home and school. This connection is a key component of a child's development and supporting further learning creates a positive experience for them. This helps them perform better academically. In a nutshell, young children's acquisition of problem-solving, language, and social-emotional skills are facilitated by interactions with their parents.

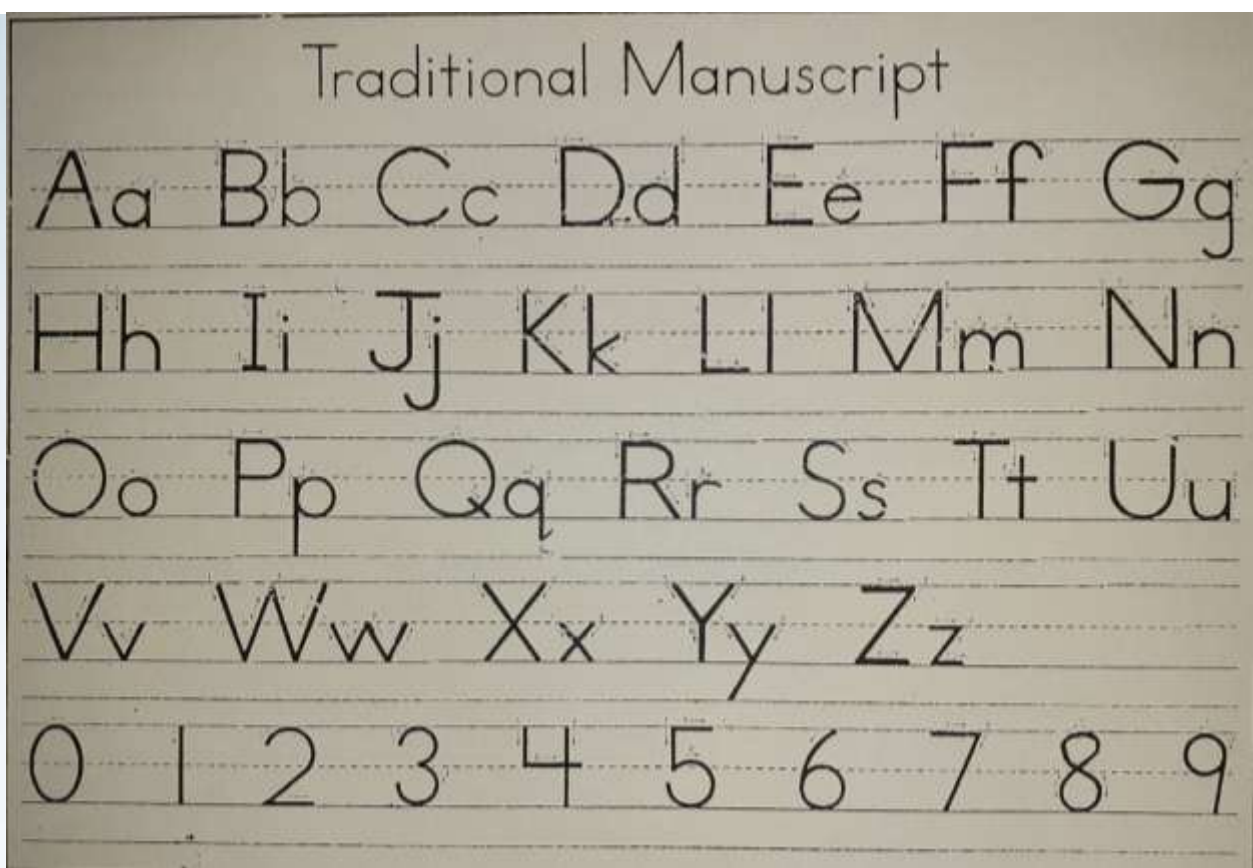

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO HAVE GOOD HANDWRITING?

Handwriting is an essential skill for both children and adults. Handwriting activates the brain more than keyboarding because it involves more complex motor and cognitive skills. Handwriting contributes to reading fluency because it activates visual perception of letters. Handwriting is a predictor of success in other subjects, because good handwriting has a positive impact on grades. Illegible handwriting can cause poor self-esteem. Poor self-esteem can trigger loss of confidence.

Cursive writing helps students, both young and old, with dyslexia. Children can have a very hard time with writing in print because many of the letters look similar, particularly b and d. Also it can feel very uncomfortable and disjointed writing in print.

A cursive writing offer each letter a very different look and allows the pupil to write in a flowing, comfortable way. This can decrease their dyslexic tendencies and make them more confident in their abilities. Children who experience difficulty mastering handwriting may avoid writing and produce poor written work. Children with poor handwriting will find it hard to proof read their own work. They will then fail to spot their mistakes and their confidence may dip even lower.

Examiners need to decipher what is written. Otherwise, pupils will achieve lower marks, even where the content may be good. Many state standardized assessments and handwritten essays emphasize the importance of handwriting. Without fast and legible handwriting, students may miss out on learning opportunities and under-achieve academically.

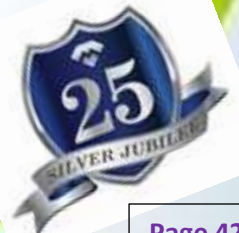

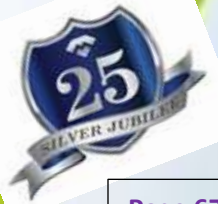

Joint Responsibilities in a Student's Success

Anytime a student performs poorly in academics or has issues with discipline, blame games usually arise between the school and the parents on who should be held responsible for the failure. The parent is also very important in the academic and behavioral success of his or her child in school. A responsible parent follows the nitty-gritties of his child's school work every evening. He does not assume that the teacher did everything in class. He or she checks the communication book and signs on it and follows any case of misbehavior recorded that day. He or she must have the class timetable to know the subjects the child had that day and whether or not there was homework or other assignments. It is the duty of such a parent to make sure that the student has completed all the assigned tasks before he or she goes to sleep. Such a parent must also fully cooperate with the school in enforcing school rules and regulations on his or her children.

In conclusion, every student must be ready to work with his parents, teachers and the school administration in achieving his or her goals. A successful student does not stop to ask questions. He or she goes further if he or she does not receive answers urgently. If such a student feels that the school is not giving her what he or she deserves in terms of quality education, he or she should be open to discuss with his or her teachers, parents and the school administration. This should, however, be done courteously and respectfully.
